STAFFING UPDATE


As part of our continued efforts to provide the best possible consistency for pupils, we have made some further adjustments to our staffing arrangements this term.

ATTENDANCE LEVELS DROP – A CRUCIAL TIME TO BE IN SCHOOL

We've seen a significant drop in attendance this week across most year groups. Only Reception and Year 1 have maintained attendance above their average for the academic year so far. All other year groups have fallen below expected levels.

While we understand that there are times when absence is unavoidable, we also want to be clear: not all reasons for absence are acceptable. Unnecessary time off has a direct impact on pupils' learning, their confidence, and their readiness for the next stage of education.

This is a crucial point in the school year. Teachers are finalising end-of-year reports, and important transition activities are underway to prepare children for their next class or key stage. Every day in school matters – not just for academic progress, but for emotional wellbeing and a smooth transition into September.
