INVESTING IN EVERY PUPIL

At All Saints, we are committed to providing every child with the opportunity to thrive—academically, physically, and emotionally. This year, we are making strategic use of two important government funding streams: the Sports Premium and the Pupil Premium.

What Are These Funds For?

Sports Premium is funding provided to primary schools to improve the quality of physical education, physical activity, and sport. It helps schools offer more opportunities for children to be active and develop healthy lifestyles.

Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools to support children who may face barriers to learning, including those eligible for free school meals or who have been in care. It is used to help close the attainment gap and ensure all pupils can succeed.

How We're Using the Sports Premium

This year, we are focusing on:

- Expanding Free Extra-Curricular Sports Clubs: Offering a wider range of inclusive, no-cost clubs for all pupils to enjoy.
- Intra- and Inter-School Competitions: Creating more opportunities for pupils to take part in friendly competitions, building confidence and teamwork.
- Upgrading Equipment: Investing in high-quality, inclusive sports equipment to improve lesson delivery and ensure safety.
- Staff Development: Supporting staff with training and planning tools to deliver engaging, progressive PE lessons.

These initiatives are designed to promote physical health, boost self-esteem, and embed a culture of active living across the school.

How We're Using the Pupil Premium

We are looking to further develop:

- Academic Support: Providing targeted interventions in reading, writing, and maths to help pupils make strong progress.
- Improving Attendance: Supporting families to ensure children are in school regularly and ready to learn.
- Enrichment Opportunities: Helping ensure all pupils can access trips, residential, and wider school experiences.
- Parental Engagement: Offering workshops and support to help parents feel confident in supporting learning at home.

Our goal is to ensure that every child—regardless of background—feels valued, supported, and inspired to achieve their best.

UNIFORM MATTERS: SUPPORTING A SMART AND SAFE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

As the weather begins to cool and we move into the autumn months, we’d like to remind families of our school’s uniform expectations and the importance of dressing appropriately for the season. A consistent approach to uniform helps promote a sense of pride, safety, and belonging across our school community.

Children from Reception to Year 6 are expected to wear the correct school uniform each day. This includes a green All Saints jumper or cardigan, a white shirt or polo shirt, and black or grey trousers, shorts, or skirt. Black shoes should be flat, closed-toe, and free from logos. Socks and tights should be black, grey, white, or green. As temperatures drop, we encourage children to wear layers to stay warm, including coats, hats, scarves, and gloves. All items should be clearly labelled with your child’s name to help prevent them from going missing.

For PE lessons, children should wear a plain green or white t-shirt or polo shirt, dark shorts, and plimsolls or soft trainers. All Saints PE t-shirts are being phased in but are not yet compulsory. Please ensure PE kits are suitable for cooler weather, and that children are aware of when their PE days are.

We ask that children do not wear jewellery, make-up, or nail varnish during school hours. The only exceptions are stud earrings or small religious items. Hair accessories and headscarves must be plain and in school colours—green, white, or black. Longer headscarves are not permitted for safety reasons.

Footwear should be practical and safe. Sandals, flip-flops, platform soles, Heelys, and high heels are not allowed. If boots are worn, they must be flat and plain black.


