attendance MATTERS



This week, our pupils have demonstrated a commendable commitment to their education through strong attendance across the school. We are proud to share the latest figures and celebrate the efforts of each year group. Starting with attendance this week:

- Reception leads the way with an outstanding 95.2%, just shy of our expected standard of 96% or above – well done!
- Year 2 follows closely at 92.5%, showing great consistency.
- Years 3 and 6 also performed well, with 92.4% and 92.0% respectively.
- Year 5 achieved a solid 91.4%.
- Year 4 and Year 1 recorded 89.7% and 88.7%, placing them in the persistent absence category (below 90%) – an area we must work together to improve.

Attendance for the Academic Year to Date:

- Year 6 tops the chart with an impressive 95.9%, right on the edge of our expected attendance zone.
- Year 2 is close behind at 95.4%, reflecting consistent dedication.
- Reception maintains a strong 94.8%, and Year 3 follows with 93.9%.
- Year 1 has achieved 91.6%, while Years 4 and 5 are at 92.5% and 92.0% respectively – all within the below expected range (90%–95.9%).

We encourage all pupils and families to aim for the green zone – where attendance meets or exceeds expectations. Regular attendance is vital for academic success, social development, and building lifelong learning habits.

THE FENLAND MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT TEAM


At All Saints Primary, we are proud to work in partnership with the Fenland Mental Health Support Team (MHST). This collaboration enables us to offer early and effective support for children and young people who may be experiencing emotional or mental health challenges.

MHST support pupils with mild to moderate needs such as low mood, challenging behaviour and anxiety.


MHST Referral

There are two main ways families can access mental health support:

- Referrals can be made by parents, carers, school staff, or the young person (aged 13–18). Focuses on early intervention for mild to moderate mental health needs.
- YOUUnited Referral Hub For children and young people aged 5–17 across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough: Referrals accepted from parents, carers, professionals, and young people. Connects families to services such as CAMHS, Centre 33, and Ormiston Families.

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
