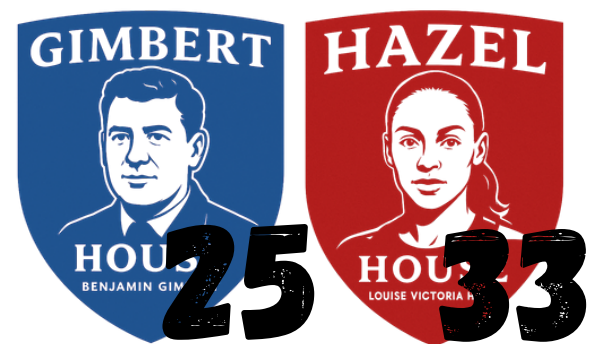
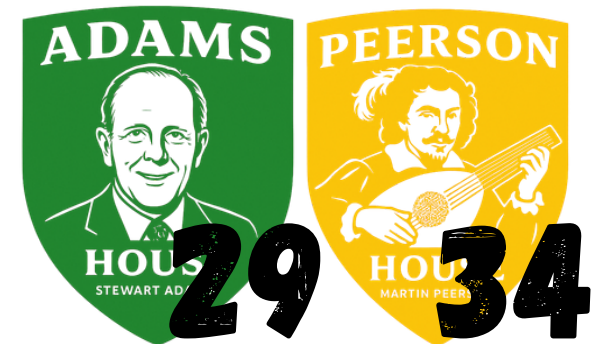

# READ to the BEAT

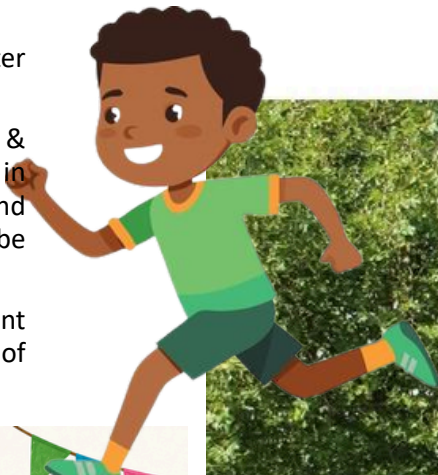
