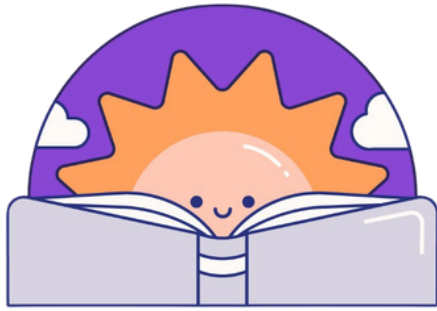

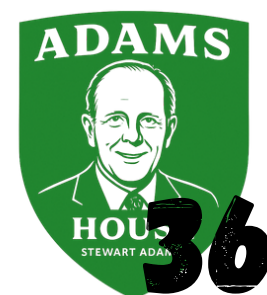

### Where can families find support?

There are several excellent local services available to support children's emotional wellbeing:

- **Keep Your Head:** Information and advice for children, young people, parents and carers.
- **Kooth:** Free online mental health and wellbeing support for young people aged 11 to 19, available without a referral.
- **Centre 33:** Free and confidential support for young people up to the age of 25, including mental health, counselling and wellbeing services.
- **YOUnted:** Emotional wellbeing and mental health support for children and young people aged 5 to 17 across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. Parents and carers can self refer.

We look forward to continuing to support our Year 6 pupils as they prepare for the next stage of their educational journey.

Families are invited to take part in Fenland Folk: Heritage and Landscape, a free programme of events taking place at March Library this summer.

Organised by the University of Cambridge and its partners, the programme celebrates the unique wildlife, history and traditions of the Fens through a series of family activities, exhibitions and talks led by researchers and local experts.

The programme begins with a Family Day on Saturday 6 June, from 12pm to 4pm, where families can enjoy a range of free activities including crafts, badge making, minibeast hunts, Fenland archaeology and opportunities to meet scientists and researchers. Visitors will also be able to explore local folklore and discover more about the landscapes that make our area so special. There is no need to book, simply drop in and join the fun.

Visitors can also enjoy a special exhibition of bird themed artwork created by local pupils from Burrowmoor Primary School and All Saints Interchurch Academy, on display at March Library until 3 July.

Throughout June, the programme will continue with a series of fascinating talks exploring butterflies, archaeology, ecology and the future of peat soils in the Fens.

All events are free to attend and offer a wonderful opportunity for children and adults alike to learn more about the history, wildlife and heritage of the place we call home.



This week, our Year 6 pupils visited March Fire Station to take part in the annual Safety Zone event, an engaging programme designed to help children stay safe in a range of real life situations.

Throughout the day, pupils participated in a series of workshops covering water safety, fire safety, dog safety and online safety. They also learned the basics of CPR, gaining valuable knowledge that could one day help them respond in an emergency.

The visit was both educational and memorable. One of the highlights for many pupils was meeting the fire station's friendly resident cat, whilst excitement levels rose even further when the fire engine was called out to a real incident during our visit, giving pupils a unique glimpse into the important work carried out by our emergency services.
